## Notable performances

■ **Tim Horst, South St. Paul baseball:** Although he is better known for his exploits on the hockey rink (he received all-state honorable mention honors), Horst put on quite a show Saturday in the Section 3AA tournament as he went 5 for 5 and drove in six runs in a 14-13 victory over Hastings. ■ **Dan Frett, Mounds View track and field:** A couple of weeks ago, Frette won three events and finished second in one in the Twin Cities Suburban East meet. He won the 110-meter high hurdles, the 300 intermediate hurdles and the high jump, and ran a leg for the runner-up 4x400 relay team. Last week, in the Section 4AA championships, he won the 110 hurdles in 15.14 seconds, the 300 hurdles in 40.45 and placed second in the high jump by clearing 6 feet, 4 inches. Frett qualified for this week's state meet in all three events.

# TRACK & FIELD HONOR ROLL

**Before 1990, only two Minnesota pole vaulters had cleared 15 feet, but eight have done it in this decade, and the state record was broken again Saturday by Jed Bergstrom of Buffalo.**

Mike Brockwell of Edina had set the record last year when he cleared 15-6 to win the Class AA championship at the Minnesota State High School League meet.

Bergstrom topped that by going 15-6 1/2 to win in the Section 2AA meet.

Saturday wasn't such a great day for the Mahtomedi boys team, which had won its second consecutive AA state true team championship two weeks earlier. The Zephyrs scored only 49 points and finished fourth in the 4AA meet behind host Stillwater, Mounds View and White Bear Lake.

But Ben Sobieski, the Iowa football recruit, did his part for the Zephyrs. He uncorked the best discus throw of the season, 175 feet, 11 inches, to win that event, and he placed second in the shot put. Mounds View's Joe Paikew won the shot with a put of 58-2 1/4. Sobieski was close behind at 57-10 1/2.

Meanwhile, Stillwater, the defending MSHSL Class AA team champ, qualified 16 athletes and 13 entries for this year's MSHSL meet on Friday and Saturday at National Sports Center in Blaine.

The Ponies owned all the events that require running more than 200 meters. They finished 1-2 in the 400; they won the 800; they finished 1-2-3 in the 1,600 and 3,200; and they won the 4x400 and 4x800 relays, missing the state record by one-tenth of a second in the 4x800 with their time of 7 minutes, 52.68 seconds.

Defending MSHSL AA girls champ Coon Rapids also won in 4AA, and the Cardinals qualified nine entries for the state meet. Katie Bestul, who won the 100-meter high hurdles and 300 low hurdles, will be back to defend her titles after winning both hurdles events at the section meet.

It is an indication of the level of competition in 4AA that three girls qualified by state standard in the 100 high hurdles. Bestul won in 15.07, and Liz Hajek of Stillwater got the other automatic spot by finishing second (15.27). But her teammate Molly Miller (15.61), Jill Cattrysse of Irondale (15.62) and Carrie Stuart of Blaine (15.77) also beat the state standard of 15.80.

Coon Rapids' Trisha Curtis was another double winner. She captured the shot put (41-3 1/2) and discus (127-5).

Apple Valley, the state AAA true team champion, won in 6AA with 133 points, and the Eagles will go into the state meet with the fastest times in three of the four relays.

They won the 4x100 in 49.82 (which is 49.6 when converted from AccuTrak to its hand-held equivalent), the 4x200 in 1:43.80 and the 4x400 in 3:57.07.
